

How to protect yourself from cyber scams

March is Fraud Prevention Month and SaskTel is reminding its customers to practice digital self-defense to protect themselves and their personal information from falling victim to cyber scams.

"Modern communications technologies have made it easier than ever to connect with our friends and loved ones, especially during this past year when those connections have mattered most," said Doug Burnett, SaskTel President and CEO. "However, with cyber criminals also using these same technologies to evolve and execute their scams, it has become increasingly important for us all to take proactive steps to protect our personal information online and to know what to do when we receive a suspicious message."

"Cyber scams look very real and anyone can be victimized. Your identity information belongs to you, and you are responsible for it. If you are asked to share your identity information, ensure you have a full understanding of what it is going to be used for, how long it will be re-

tained, and if it will be further disseminated," said Inspector Andrew Farquhar, Officer-in-Charge of Federal Operations for the Saskatchewan RCMP. "Cyber scams see no borders. We encourage anyone who may have fallen victim to a cyber scam to report these to us immediately because it may assist police in advancing our investigations and help us identify additional victims in Saskatchewan or across Canada."

Digital Self-Defense – Proactive Protection Tips:

* Use a strong and unique password or passphrase for each online account.

* Don't share personal or other sensitive information on social media or online.

* Use strong anti-virus and anti-malware/spyware software programs on your devices.

* Keep your device software up to date and install critical security patches as soon as they are available.

* Know that a legitimate business will never ask for you to confirm personal or account information in an unsolicited email, phone call or message.

Digital Self-Defense – What to do if you receive a

suspicious message?

* Do not open the message, report it to complaint.abuse@sasktel.com and then delete it. In some cases, simply opening the message may compromise the security of your device.

* If you opened the message, do not reply to it or

click on any links or attachments. Instead, follow up with the person or business who supposedly sent it by navigating to their website through a legitimate search engine or by contacting the person directly. If you think you have fallen victim to a cyber scam

you should immediately report it to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre by calling 1-888-495-8501. All types of fraud can also be reported to the Saskatchewan RCMP by calling 310-RCMP or contacting your local police service.

Additionally, you should

act quickly to change your online passwords, and inform essential businesses, such as your financial institution, that your information may have been compromised so that the necessary steps can be taken to secure your accounts.

Donations aid Borden School tech campaign

A fundraising campaign to purchase Chromebooks for educational use at Borden School is closer to its \$7,400 goal thanks to recent donations from businesses and individuals in the community.

So far, the school has raised \$1,600 toward its 'Technology Campaign.'

The school currently has about 50 Chromebooks and 30 iPads used by students for classroom study. Last year, the school received 30 Chromebooks from the Prairie Spirit School Division through the division's regular technology rollout program. Those devices are being supplemented by the purchase of an additional 20 Chromebooks and a Chromecart to house them. The small computers are used by students in Grades 3-12.

If the school is ever required to move to at-home learning due to COVID-19 health protocols, the Chromebooks and iPads will enable students to continue their education online without interruption.

Affinity Credit Union donated \$500 to the school's Technology Campaign.

As part of its Community Spirit Employee Fund, Affinity also allocates \$200 for each of its employees to donate to a charity of their choice. Affinity Credit Union staff mem-

ber, Lynette Schmidt, whose children attend the school, directed her allocation to the school's Technology Campaign.

In addition, a donation to the campaign was made by a locally-owned business, James' Repair Service. The owner of the business has children who attend Borden School.

The school also brought in close to \$800 through the sale of chocolates earlier this win-

ter. School officials said technology is an integral part of everyone's lives, and computer literacy is critical for students.

"We are committed to ensuring our students are equipped with devices to enhance their learning," said school officials in a statement thanking campaign donors.

The enrollment of Borden School is 100 students in Kindergarten through Grade 12.

PUBLIC NOTICE RM of Laird No. 404 Zoning Bylaw Amendment

Public Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Rural Municipality (RM) of Laird No. 404 intends to adopt a bylaw under The Planning and Development Act, 2007, to amend Bylaw No. 6-2008, known as The Zoning Bylaw.

INTENT: The proposed amendment would: allow for smaller than prescribed agricultural site sizes in the A-Agricultural District subject to new predefined criteria to remedy issues of access and agricultural parcel consolidations; allow for larger than prescribed site size in the AR-Agricultural Residential district subject to new predefined criteria; rezone from A to AR District a portion of land related to a proposed subdivision; and rezone a portion of land from M-Industrial/Commercial District to CR1-Country Residential 1 District to reflect current land use.

AFFECTED LAND: Lands within the A and AR Districts would be affected by the proposed amendments providing site size flexibility. A portion of SE ¼ 1-41-7-W3M would be rezoned from A to AR District. Parcel A, Plan 101649180 Ext. 91, within SE ¼ 1-43-5-W3M, would be rezoned from M to CR1 District. A copy of the proposed amendment with maps showing the areas of rezoning are located for public view at <https://rmoflaird.ca/category/rm-notices/>.

REASON: The RM is wishing to: provide some site size flexibility in the A and AR Districts where appropriate and consistent with its planning policies; rezoning a portion of land to the AR is required to accommodate a proposed subdivision; and rezoning to the CR1 District has been requested by the owner to reflect current land use which no longer includes a commercial component.

PUBLIC INSPECTION: Any person may inspect the bylaw at the RM of Laird No. 404 office during regular office hours, excluding statutory holidays.
