Dear Executive Director,

The purpose of this report is to formally notify the Ministry of Agriculture that the Rural Municipality of Corman Park No. 344 is submitting all required documentation in accordance with Section 23 of *The Plant Health Act* for the 2025 reporting year. This submission reflects the monitoring, inspections, and enforcement activities undertaken throughout the season to support the municipality’s responsibilities under the legislation.

The following supporting documents are provided for the Ministry’s review:

- One copy of the Annual Pest Report summarizing municipal pest control activities and outcomes.
- One copy of all agreements and orders issued during the season.

Pest Inspection Summary

Over the course of the reporting period, inspections were completed across a range of agricultural, commercial, and rural properties within the municipality. These inspections were conducted in accordance with approved protocols and focused on identifying regulated pests, evaluating compliance, and ensuring that required mitigation measures were implemented.

Agreements and Orders Issued

Hidden Valley Dairies

This report package includes both the educational agreement and the formal order issued to Hidden Valley Dairies. The property had a well-documented history of rodent activity, prompting the development of an agreement to address outstanding concerns. The agreement was signed on May 13th, 2025. The landowner initially committed to fully resolving the issue within a two-week timeframe; however, this commitment was not met, and a formal order was subsequently issued to ensure compliance. Following enforcement actions, the required remedial work was successfully completed, resulting in a significant improvement in property conditions and a notable reduction in pest activity which is still ongoing.

Riverside Dairies

Included are the voluntary property clean-up plan and the educational agreement established with Riverside Dairies. This property was identified as having substantial rodent issue, likely due to storage practices and site conditions. The agreement, signed on September 24, 2025, outlines the corrective measures required to reduce pest habitat and improve sanitation. Since signing the agreement, the landowner has undertaken progressive site clean-up, and a consistent baiting program has been initiated. Remediation efforts remain ongoing, and continued monitoring will occur into the next season.

Neuview Dairies

Also enclosed is the voluntary property clean-up plan and educational agreement with Neuview Dairies. An inspection identified multiple areas of concern, including evidence of rodent activity and conditions conducive to infestation. An agreement was formalized on September 29, 2025. Since that time, the landowner has demonstrated strong cooperation, implemented a comprehensive baiting program and completing substantial site remediation efforts. Follow-up inspections indicate meaningful progress, with improvements expected to continue as further preventative measures are applied.

Other Infested Properties

The remaining properties where rat infestations were identified were determined to be minor in nature. These situations were addressed promptly and effectively through the installation of bait stations and the application of approved rodenticides, in conjunction with improvements to general site sanitation. Property owners were advised on the importance of maintaining clean and orderly yards to prevent re-infestation, and compliance was achieved without the need for further enforcement actions or Educational Agreements.
